The Yorta Yorta, Dja Dja Wurrung and Taungurung people are the traditional owners of the land. The local indigenous population is proportionally high and this is reflected in the arts and culture on offer locally. There is an annual Koori Arts and Craft Market featuring bush tucker which is always well attended. The old Echuca Court House in the historic Port precinct is owned by the local Indigenous people and they have plans to turn it into a gallery and café.

Investment in our region continues to grow, examples include the new purpose built Echuca Distillery and The Strawberry Pick.

Locally and globally, the food industry has evolved to suit new tastebuds. The Camel Milk Company in Kyabram produces milk for supply domestically and internationally and has a range of body products such as soaps, moisturisers etc. The Camel Milk Company's products have been featured on the Australian television cooking show, Masterchef and are a popular addition to local restaurant menus.

Events play a vital role in the celebration of our food and wine offering, bringing together visitors and locals alike. Festivals celebrating our local product are paramount in cementing our region as a food and wine destination. Echuca plays host to Flavours on the Wharf, Pop and Pour Festival and a number of satellite Melbourne Food and Wine Festival events.

Campaspe are working together with the Murray Regional Tourism Board and all of the other Shires along the Murray River, from Albury to Mildura on a farm to plate program. The program is designed to boost awareness of the region's food and wine related products and experiences and uptake of the same. It also aims to improve the quality, authenticity and availability of offerings to visitors and locals.

Campaspe Shire offer free bike hire in the Port of Echuca with the aim of encouraging visitors to get out and explore the region and discover local producers in close proximity. Many of the users will purchase some produce and then cycle to a scenic spot and enjoy a picnic overlooking the Murray River.
